What can we say? We knew that 2003 would be a pivotal year for us as we enter the new year with anticipation and excitement. Our anticipation comes from a sure knowledge that God will do great things and in his providence we want to be directly involved. Excitement comes from the freshness that every day brings as we move and work within the framework of his will.

Jody spent January and February in Eastern Europe conducting English Language Evangelism events. March was filled with prison ministries with Champions for Life and planning and preparation for a summer full of ministry in Mexico and Eastern Europe.

Report on Eastern Europe Ministry

Jody had the privilege of traveling to Minsk, Belarus in early January to finalize the preparations for the two-week English Language Evangelism event headed by Michael Gott. At the Bethlehem Baptist Church in that city of 2.2 million people, more than 900 adults

were enrolled in the two-week event. More than 800 of those were non-believers and most of them had no church affiliation whatsoever. In association with the Michael Gott International Evangelistic Association and under the leadership and direction of Michael Gott, we have been privileged to train and lead teams of American Christians overseas to present English Language Evangelism Events in Romania, Belarus, Ukraine, Poland, and Cuba.

The results have been nothing short of incredible. If it were not for the greatness of our God, it would be impossible to explain the numbers of people we have personally seen come to Christ, and the miracles that have taken place

Using a unique blend of friendship evangelism and English as a Foreign Language (EFL) curriculum (developed

What is a "Faith" Ministry?

This simply means that we do not receive a regular salary from any church or organization. Instead, we rely on God to provide for us through his people. God leads individuals. churches and organizations to support this type of ministry. We let people know of our needs through letters, phone calls, speaking engagements, personal contacts, and even newsletters. Then we simply wait on God to provide. These finances are then used to supply our living and ministry expenses, which will allow us to devote our full time and energy to ministry.

Champions for Life

Founded by Bill Glass, Champions for Life goes into prison and jail faciliteis all over the United States each year.

Men and women volunteers go into the prisons and meet with inmates one-on-one. It is not at all unusual to have hundreds of first time decisions made in a single facility.

We are vocal recruiters for this vital ministry as we volunteer for Champions for Life whenever we are not overseas.

especially for this ministry), we are able to gather hundreds of nationals together for a two-week conversational English course in a local evangelical church. Each missionaryteacher takes classes of 8 to 15 nationals and begins to build a relationship with them through the English lessons. After only a few days, the friendships are established and each team member/teacher is invited to present their testimony to their classes and clearly present the Gospel message.

During the final days of the event, the Gospel is again presented through preaching, and the students are encouraged to respond to the message. During 2001 and 2002 alone, Trisha and I have personally witnessed hundreds of adults invite Jesus into their lives.

Follow-up and discipleship are important to our ministry. Therefore, the host churches with which we partner in the host country make a special commitment to following-up on each person, regardless of their decision. The church receives from us the names, addresses, and telephone numbers of each student, and whether or not they

made a decision for Christ. Because many church members are also involved in our English lessons, the un-churched students have developed relationships with the church and church members.

We are dedicated to continuing to reach people through this unique ministry. As God leads His people to support us, we are grateful to God for His provision. Our prayer and desire is to spend at least 28 weeks each year overseas in direct ministry, with the rest of our time devoted to recruiting, training, and preparing teams to join us as well as being involved in other short -term direct ministries here in the United States.

In addition to the English Language Evangelism Events in Cuba and Eastern Europe, we partner with missionaries and Baptist churches in Mexico to do short-term evangelistic ministries such as VBS, ministry to women, and evangelism services. This has proved to be a very effective way to introduce adults and teens to direct, evangelistic missions.
