The march will last about 2 hours and can be watched live at *Prayer March 2020* from noon to 2 pm (EDST, 11am-1pm CDST).

Some of you have expressed interest in reading news of Nicaragua yourselves. You are not surprised to know that the Nicaraguan government controls many of the news outlets. Nonetheless, there are some independent news organizations still operating. One resource we have found is *Today Nicaragua* (in English). While we must be careful about trusting what we read on the internet (especially news sources), *Today Nicaragua* seems to be as useful as any we have found. The *Today Nicaragua* site also has links to some of the Spanish language outlets that are not government controlled.
